







London Tae Kwon-Do (UK-TKD)

Meanings of Belts in Tae Kwon-Do

Belt Colour	Grade	Meaning
White	10th & 9th Kup 	White represents innocence - that of a student with no previous knowledge of Tae Kwon-Do.
Yellow	8th & 7th Kup 	Signifies the earth from which a plant sprouts and takes root as Tae Kwon-Do foundations are being laid.
Green	6th & 5th Kup 	Represents the plants growth as Tae Kwon-Do skills begin to develop.
Blue	4th & 3rd Kup 	Blue signifies the Heaven towards which the plant matures into a towering tree as training in Tae Kwon-Do progresses.
Red	2nd & 1st Kup 	Red signifies danger cautioning the student to exercise control and warning the opponent to stay away.
Black	Dan Grades 	Black is the opposite of white, signifying maturity and proficiency in Tae Kwon-Do. It also indicates the wearer is impervious to darkness and fear.
